Cheryl-Ann Stadelbauer-Sampa: Cheryl-Ann was born and raised in Toronto where she completed her undergraduate studies at York University and her M. Div. at Emmanuel College. As part of her preparation for ministry, she served four months as an overseas intern in Zambia where she met her husband, James. Cheryl-Ann was ordained in 1983 and settled to Egmondville United Church where she remained until 1997 when she moved to Central United Church in Stratford. In 2012 she became the Executive Secretary of London Conference and, in 2019, at the time of structural change, she became the Executive Minister for Antler River Watershed, Western Ontario Waterways and Horseshoe Falls regional councils. As of January 1, 2024, Cheryl-Ann moved into the position of Senior Governance Support Lead with the General Council, involving support for the General Council Executive, the 45th General Council, the 100th Anniversary Commemoration, and the evaluation of structural change. The third annual general meeting of the United Church Women of Western Ontario Waterways Region was held at Forest Hill United Church, Kitchener. Women gathered at 11:30, and were welcomed by Jacqui Diverty with name tags, and Joyce Osborne with travel reimbursement forms. Rev. Sue Campbell of Elmira United Church offered copies of her book for sale, Spirit Refresh. We expected a book table from The Christian Resource Centre, Mitchell, but they were unable to attend because of illness. Women gathered in the Parlour for our Bag Lunch, with refreshments provided by the women of Forest Hill. We were greeted by Betty Kocher, President of the local UCW, who gave the lunch blessing.

At 1 p.m we gathered in the sanctuary for the meeting. The meeting was available by Livestream, arranged by Margot White of Forest Hill United Church. The 60th Anniversary banner was hung on the lectern. Eleanor Firth, Member at Large, led in hymn singing. The pianist was Barbara Kellerman of Calvary Memorial United Church, Kitchener.

Betty Kocher welcomed everyone in the sanctuary as well as those joining by livestream and Mary Hawthorne lit the Christ candle. Anne Reuber spoke about the power of the small light in a dark room. After Easter, there is Hope, as we walk the road. Nancy Risto, President of National United Church Women, brought greetings, saying "with Faith there is Hope". Kathy Douglas, Faith Formation Minister, Antler River Watershed, Horseshoe Falls, Western Ontario Waterways Regional Councils, brought greetings. Anne Reuber read the Land Acknowledgment for the Kitchener area.

The Meeting was constituted by Anne Reuber - "I declare the Annual Meeting of the United Church Women of Western Ontario Waterways duly constituted in the name of Jesus Christ and with the guidance of the Holy Spirit to thoughtfully and prayerfully deal with all matters of business that may rightfully come before it."

Kim Posno introduced our Guest Speaker and Worship leader, Lori Neale of General Council's Church in Mission Unit. April 22 is Earth Day, and Lori talked about Climate Justice, and what is happening in the United Church across Canada. Her presentation included a video by Rev. Carmen Lansdowne, 44th Moderator of The United Church of Canada. Our UCW meeting is one of 90 within The United Church of Canada today, talking about climate change. It is an opportunity to talk about what we love in creation, and how it has changed, and how we feel about it. The four pillars of the United Church climate action are Putting our house in order, Raising our Spirited voices, Connection with earth and Our response to climate impacts. Worship was based on John 20: 19-31. The offering was presented by Jacquie Diverty for dedication. The offering will be sent to the Healing Fund, the Five year project of the National United Church Women. Nancy Lennox thanked the speaker.

Barbara Seaton presented the In Memoriam from Page 5 of the Annual Report. We remember UCW members no longer with us since our last AGM. We sang "In the Bulb There is a Flower" a very appropriate hymn.

Activity Report – 2023

The Executive of UCW of WOW is 12 women from across the Region. The Staff Support is Rev. Kathy Douglas, Faith Formation Minister for the Region. The Executive meets virtually, by Zoom. During 2023, the Executive met six times, to discuss the business of UCW and to plan three meetings of the larger group.

February Virtual Gathering: On February 11, **Joni Shawana**, Healing Program Coordinator, Indigenous Ministries & Justice for the UCC, introduced the National UCW Special 5-year Project at our winter virtual Gathering. Approximately 80 women attended the live stream session, including some women from across Canada.

Annual Meeting: On April 22, the Annual Meeting was held at Forest Hill United Church in Kitchener. This was an in-person meeting and livestreamed. The women gathered for a bag lunch, with refreshments by the women of Forest Hill. We had music, worship, and review of the Annual Report. The guest speaker was Lori Neale of General Council's Church in Mission Unit, talking about Climate Change. The Executive was installed by Nancy Risto, President of the National UCW.

Fall Meeting: On November 4, the women met at Calvary United Church in St Jacobs. This was an in-person meeting and livestreamed. The women gathered for a bag lunch. There was music, worship and then a presentation by a panel of Climate Motivators. Connor Russell, Jackson Rukundo, Jyla Mills and Sifa Kanyamuneza were part of a group of 15 young students that met in 2023 with people across Canada to identify concerns and needs regarding climate changes and environmental issues.

Communications: Mary Hawthorne and Diane Bender circulate Minutes and News with every unit via email. WOW Newsletters were distributed in 2023 in June, September and December. The National UCW Keeping In Touch Newsletter was distributed in 2023 in January and June.

Assessments and Money: An Assessment is collected from each unit in the Region to cover the expenses related to holding an in-person meeting, and to cover the expense of the Executive. The Assessment is calculated on the number of members in each unit. The Treasurer Report is included in the Annual Report, and it will be approved at the Annual Meeting.

Outreach: We continue to support the five year project chosen by The National United Church Women in 2022, The Healing Fund. A report is included in the Annual Report. Locally, we are encouraged to support the three summer camps in our Region. They are Camp Bimini, Camp Menesetung and Silver Lake United Church Camp.

National United Church Women: In September 2023, Anne Reuber and Edith Coyle represented the Western Ontario Waterways Region and the meeting of representatives from all Regions of Canada. Their report is included in the Annual Report.

Discipleship and Justice Commission of WOW Regional Council

Attending meetings at this Commission on behalf of WOW UCW has been an enlightening experience for me. Our United Church of Canada is very involved in many areas of everyday-living in our country.

There have been several conversations regarding the remit – a voting process necessary when changing our basic by-laws within the United Church. A "yes"decision will enable the Indigenous church within the UC to establish its own structure. This will be important in furthering our right relations with Indigenous people.

Our Commission received many requests for grants, and we spent time selecting and prioritizing our response to those applications:

- right relations
- camps (Bimini, Menesetung, Silver Lake)
- youth and faith formation,
- chaplaincy.
- two resource centres (Mitchell, Grand River)
- The Hub
- 5 Oaks .

The grants totalled \$135,000.

Rev. Kathy Douglas introduced a new and exciting event, "Audacious Hope", to be held at Brock University, St Catherines. July 3—6 2024. The UCC will be working in partnership with the Presbyterian Church. Kathy is on the planning team and Andrew Hyde will be one of the leaders. Jim Cain will also be one of the presenters and will provide Camp Training for leaders.

Kathy Douglas is looking for help in how we can help provide resources and support for peace in the Palestine/Israel conflict.

National United Church Women (NUCW) Report of the Work of the National UCW for 2023

The National UCW Executive continues to reach out nationally through the newsletter *Keeping in Touch*.

There is also a 5-day in-person meeting each September of the Regional UCW Presidents from across Canada in Mississauga. Edith Coyle and I attended on your behalf. We renewed friendships, passed the reports from the previous year of the UCW at work across Canada and approved the budget for 2024. We worshipped and prayed, sang and talked. We mourned the loss of UCW units across Canada in which we and others have been nourished, comforted and challenged.

But above all, we were raised up with hope that the presence of God is still with us, even if our church structures are changing. God is not done with us yet.

Good news!

- In 2023, UCW members gave \$494 217 for Mission & Service. This is a story of Hope!
- Since its inception in the fall of 2022, United Church Women of UCC raised \$28, 383 for the NUCW 5-Year Anniversary Project supporting the Regina Native Outreach Ministries Baby & Mother Welcome Bags. You continue to take seriously the United Church's commitment to Truth and Reconciliation.
- The Right Rev. Dr. Carmen Lansdowne, Moderator of the UCC spoke to us about signs of hope for her in the United Church. She talked about two national youth programmes specifically.

Climate Motivator Programme

- The UCC sponsored 15 diverse young people, aged 15-18 years from across Canada for the Summer Youth Climate Motivators Programme. Each young adult was recommended by his/her local community of faith, and each designed a "passion project" around environment change to implement with their home community of faith. Some of you met four of these young people from WOW Region at our November Gathering in 2023.
- Twelve youth from Shining Waters Region and 12 Indigenous Youth from across Canada were teamed up with each other in a 3-week

canoeing group. The Moderator joined this group as they bonded together over the three weeks as friends and as they learned bout Indigenous culture, the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, traditional medicine teachings and back-country canoeing skills. She said "This one project [young people and their friendships] is enough. If Nothing else remained of the United Church of Canada, it is enough!"

 PS. She also got dumped from her canoe twice, though she assured us it was not her fault!

We also recognized the declining and aging membership of the UCW, and heard how some women across Canada are trying new ways of supporting women locally. Several regions are experimenting with virtual meetings with women whose UCW's and churches have closed. Other women are continuing to meet much more informally; some with a "Bring your own lunch" and social and worship time; others with an invitation to get together and talk.

Edith and I were privileged to attend this weeklong meeting in Mississauga.. We came home raised up with hope that perhaps our work as the UCW has not been in vain. There are others whose faith and strength will continue to sustain communities and individuals and reach people in ways we could never dream.

It is good to be reminded that in our lifetimes, we experience only a fraction of the generosity of the Holy Mystery. We share only a tiny part of the hugeness of the God's great generosity.
